This position reports to the Head of the School of Community Health Sciences, Counseling and Counseling Psychology.

The program is seeking a forward-thinking leader who will build on the breadth and strength of its undergraduate and graduate programs and educational model while inspiring collaborative relationships both within and outside the university. The candidate must demonstrate a deep commitment to and experience in diversity, research, developing and maintaining a strong curriculum, obtaining external funding, inter-professional and collaborative education, and progressive approaches to public health education and practice.
